

Home visits

Bishnumaya is an elderly lady living alone. She is partially sighted and previously suffered from leprosy, spending many years in hospital. Now her sister is so poor she can no longer provide for Bishnumaya. Shining Glory Mission Nepal has supplied her with a small gas stove and is arranging an operation hopefully improve her sight.



Basundali is 78 years old. She is the only Christian in her family, and her family members do not want to take care of her. She has a fractured femur and needs admission to hospital, but her family did not take her. She is living outside the house on the veranda, isolated and denied independence and medical care.

Support for Pastors

Dhanbir Nepali is serving people in a hilly area above Kathmandu. He is now sick and elderly. The people who come to the church are poor laborers working on the land, so they are unable to give money for the support of the

pastor. Shining Glory Mission Nepal gives financial aid to Dhanbir and pastors like him for their support and to help with payment of churches' rent. Such is the need in Nepal where people are hungry for the Gospel. Now that the country is open for the good news of Jesus Christ, we must take advantage of this opportunity given by God by supporting pastors who are reaching out to help people in remote and unreached areas of Nepal.

Our Mission

- ° To create and support non-formal education programs to meet the needs of the poor

Introduction

Nepal is located in South Asia and is a landlocked country bordering China on the north and India on the south. Nepal is one of the poorest countries in the world, but it has the highest mountain in the world, Mount Everest. Its total population is 27 million. Life expectancy is 63 years for men and 64 years for women; 57 percent of the population is employed, 81 percent of them in agriculture. The literacy rate is 58 percent for men and 42 percent for women.

Activities

Shining Glory Church was established five years ago in Swayambhunath, Kathmandu by Pastor Joshua. Since then we have established other four churches in Nepal serving 997 baptized believers.

Shining Glory Church's main goal is to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ to everyone in Nepal and to establish new churches to spread the word of God. Shining Glory Churches don't own their buildings, and most Shining Glory Churches are basic bamboo huts, too small for the Fellowship and without toilets or electricity.

Shining Glory Churches facilitate a one-year diploma in Christian Ministry through SGM Nepal. The mission trains and equips Nepalese Christian workers and leaders. Our courses teach spiritually sound discipline and prepare attendees to face the challenges and needs of the churches in Nepal.



Shining Glory Churches offer programs to enhance income-generation capabilities of the poorest of the poor.

Shining Glory Mission operates an orphanage in a rented bamboo hut for eight children, with almost 20 others on the waiting list. At the same location we have a rented bamboo hut where eight elderly men and women stay. The orphans and the



elderly receive physical, emotional, spiritual, and education support in the form of food, clothes, shelter, and medical treatment; counseling, encouragement, and prayer during regular meetings and special programs.

Shining Glory Healing Center

Pastor Joshua Khadka and his wife, Elizabeth, have received a healing gift from God. They are using this gift to benefit any kind of sick person. God has healed many sick people through our prayers, including very dangerous diseases like diabetes, kidney failure, cancer, and other serious illnesses.



We had a healing meeting in Deep Jyoti church and in houses in Pokhara and other places in Nepal, attended by people with various chronic diseases like cancer, tuberculosis, asthma, kidney

failure, diabetes and epilepsy. Also attending were blind, lame, deaf and dumb people and those possessed by demon spirits.

Sick people also come to our Shining Glory Healing Center in Katmandu. Most of them are healed after prayer, and other churches are now calling Pastor Joshua and Elizabeth to healing meetings to pray for the sick. Individuals also call for Pastor Joshua's prayers – Nowadays we are getting many letters, e-mails, and telephone calls from different parts of Nepal. We have a prayer team that prays continually for all sick people. We are asking God and you for support so that we can extend our work to other healing centers in different parts of the country.

Tik Bahadur Purja and his wife, Hira, are serving God as leaders in Deep Jyoti Church in Pokhara. Four years ago Hira's kidneys failed, and after dialysis for three-and-a-half years she received a new kidney. The surgery was not a

success; in December 2010 both kidneys failed. Further dialysis did not work, and doctors in Pokhara and Kathmandu told the Purjas to prepare for Hira's death.



Pastor Joshua prayed with Tik Bahadur and Hira at the hospital and then invited the couple to his home. After deep prayer, Hira regained her speech later that day and asked for some food. Over the next eight days of prayer, Hira became stronger and stronger. When she returned to the hospital, the doctors were frankly amazed to find her kidneys functioning well.

God's gift of healing through the hands of Pastor Joshua and Elizabeth has cured Hira completely. Praise the Lord.

Future Plans

- ° To open an elderly day-care center
- ° To build a home for the orphans and elderly
- ° To build a church building for fellowship
- ° To facilitate the empowerment of poor women by teaching sewing skills and literacy programs
- ° To promote health awareness, especially in remote and unreached areas of Nepal
- ° To increase our support to more orphans and elderly

Those who sponsor a particular child or elderly person will receive regular letters and school or health progress reports four times a year, and they can also write directly to the person they are sponsoring. All gifts will be receipted for tax purposes.
